
# **DEMOGRAPHIC TRENDS IN THE MIDDLE PENINSULA**

### Where are people going, and why?

A recent study surveyed the opinions of two key demographics **millennials and retirement-age individuals**—within the Middle Peninsula (MP) to identify their living preferences and perceptions of the region. The study intends to shed light on the needs of both the MP's new and exiting workforce as well as draw upon the insight of the MP's experienced citizens. Findings below represent the responses of the survey participants.





### **51%**


#### Are likely to live in the Middle Peninsula **in the next 5 years**

## **38%** Are likely to live in the Middle Peninsula **in the next 20 years**

#### The Millennial Perspective

42% would want to live in a rural area
80% consider affordability and proximity to job as important
71% say that there is not enough to do *but*78% would live in MP if close to job
47% say the area does not have good internet

86% Plan to the Mid

Plan to **retire permanently** in the Middle Peninsula

65% Say there are **not enough** retirement community options

#### The Pre/Post Retirement Perspective

96% say healthcare facilities are important when considering retirement options
83% say their current healthcare needs are met *but*65% say their <u>future</u> healthcare needs will be met
97% agree that there are many ways to be involved in the community
